Bio:

My name is Paul Katchadourian and here is my story. I was born in Fresno California on June 11 1962. My Dad had a commercial waste hauling business at the time. We move to Encino Ca. when I was three so my mother could be closer to her family. I attended grade school there until 1974 when my Dad wanted to move back to Fresno to Farm grapes.

I worked on the farm raking in 2 dollars an hour so I could buy my own car at 16. I saved up \$3,000.00 and on my  $16^{th}$  birthday I went down and purchased a 1971 Datsun 240Z. I loved that car even though it didn't have air conditioning. In Fresno that's important!

After High school and a year of college I joined the Army. This was during Ronald Reagan's presidency and I wanted to serve. I asked the recruiter what was the hardest job they had? He said "Special Forces", only if you flunk out you are open for worldwide assignment. I enlisted as a light weapons specialist. That meant infantry basic training at Ft. Benning Georgia. in July. That was my first experience with humidity. I remember getting off the bus being stripped down and two hundred of us doing PT with no cloths on.

I went through all the SF training and landed on a scuba team. We trained hard and I even went through Danish combat dive school. I enjoyed the Army and was getting out after 4 years so I could go back to school and become an Officer. Two weeks prior to getting out I went off a cliff snow skiing on a training mission. I shattered my elbow and have not had full use of it since. I am now a disabled Veteran with 50% disability. My whole right side is shot from my years as a Green Beret Para-trooper. I went to school anyway and attended Fresno State as a Poly Sci. major. I figured I would work for the FBI or CIA. Well as it happens life throws you curve balls. By then I was married, raising two girls. One semester away from graduating college I lost my job because the business closed. A friend told me I could make some money hauling Grapes to the winery over the summer.

Over the next 15 years I owned Katch Trucking with 10 tractors hauling food grade juice from Mexico to Canada and everywhere else in-between. It was a very successful business but I got tired of hauling out of state with all the regulations and changes. I decided to sell all the trucks and even my home as a complete do over.

When I went to sell my home a couple that happened to be attorneys asked for a mold test. I said" Mold test? I never heard of such a thing. I guess I had a water heater that leaked years before and I had a leak under my sink that I fixed but not before it stained the bottom. They paid for the mold test and I flunked. I asked the inspector how do I un-flunk? He looked around and said \$30,000.00 should do it. I told him "Really! Labor, material, permit and taxes all came up to even 30K wow that's convenient. I get to write a check for such an even number.

I decided to do some research on mold remediation. I went to school in Washington State for mold inspection and remediation. I came back to Fresno and remediated my home and passed the clearance test. Total cost was 10% of what I was told. I then decided if a guy was honest he could actually make a living doing this. From there I became a State of California Lead Inspector/Assessor. That led into General construction, Asbestos abatement, General Engineering, and back to where I started, trucking.

I am the now the hazardous abatement contractor for the California High speed Rail. I am working for Tutor Perini/Zachry/Parsons. I haul my own waste and am looking into more trucking opportunities.

Life has gone full circle.
